

Early Talk Boost research project – would you like to take part in a study and receive free resources and training for your setting?

What is Early Talk Boost?

Early Talk Boost is an intervention for 3 to 4-year-olds who struggle with talking and understanding of words. It is 9 weeks long – three 15–20-minute sessions a week – typically with a group of around 6-8 children (but no less than 3).



What is the research?

This research project, funded by the Education Endowment Foundation (EEF), aims to support education recovery following the pandemic, whilst also developing our understanding of effective professional development in the early years.



Why should my setting get involved?

If your setting is eligible, it will receive support including:

- Early Talk Boost intervention pack worth £500
- Free training for two practitioners
- Funding to reimburse 50% staff time for training
- Thank you payment of £400

Is my setting eligible to take part?
